"O Store Gud"

Text: Carl S. Boberg, 1859-1940; tr. And adapt. Stuart K. Hine, 1899-1989

During the summer of 1885 Carl G. Boberg was returning home from a meeting in Krönobäck, Sweden. In response to the beauty of nature around him and the ringing of church bells, he wrote "O Store Gud." It was published in the March 13, 1886, issue of *Mönsterås Tidningen* and with the tune in the April 16, 1891 issue of the weekly *Sanningsvittnet*. (From 1890 to 1916 Boberg edited the *Sanningsvittnet* ("Witness of the Truth") a publication of the Missionary Society of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Sweden.)

A German translation in 1907, "Wie gross du bist" by Manfred von Glehn (1867-1924) popularized the hymn in Germany. Two decades later, a Russian translation from the German was made by I.S. Prokhanoff (1869-1933). Baptists in Poland published it in *Kimvali*, 1927. Stuart K. Hine, working as a Methodist missionary in the Ukraine, learned of the Russian version without knowing of the original Swedish. During a thunderstorm several years later, in the 1930s, when he was a missionary in Ruthenia in eastern Czechoslovakia, he made an English version. He later added two more stanzas, largely of his own and then in England in 1948 he added a fourth. (The difference between the hymn as now sung and the original are so great that only a few phrases are attributed to the Swedish original.)

In 1949 it was published with a Russian version in a Russian gospel magazine called *Grace and Peace*. George Beverly Shea (b. 1909) saw it during a Billy Graham Crusade to London in 1954. He and Cliff Barrows (b. 1923) used it in 1955 at the Billy Graham Crusade in Toronto, after which it became identified with Shea, Barrows and Billy Graham.
